Cesar's new Tangram kitchen made quite the splash when it debuted at EuroCucina in Milan last year, so we weren't too surprised to see it again as the headline act at Espresso Design's newly rebranded showroom – Cesar at Espresso – in London's Design Centre, Chelsea Harbour. LITTLE WONDER
